Key Numbers of Year 2019

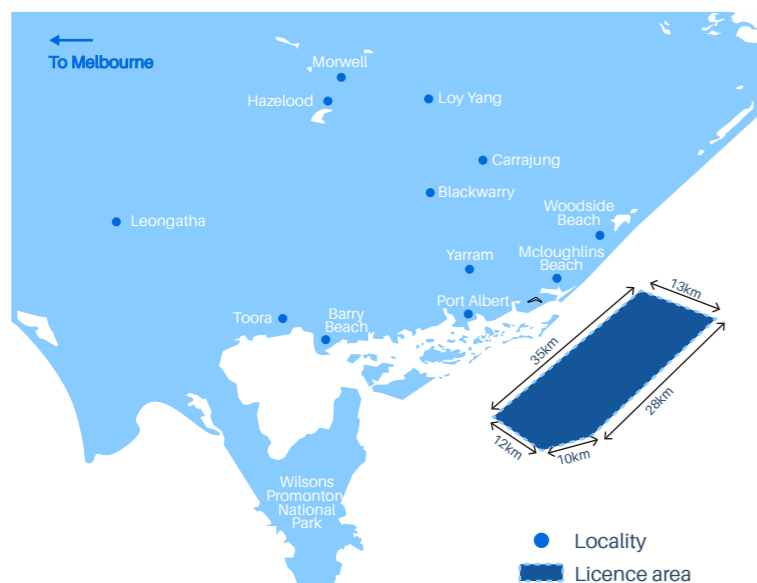

Australia's First Offshore Wind Project



The Star of the South project now is in its feasibility phase. Planned for the south coast of Gippsland, the \$8 billion project will provide 2200 MW of clean energy to homes across Victoria and bring jobs to the area.

The proposed wind farm is situated approximately 10 km off the coast and will utilise the strong grid systems in Latrobe Valley as well as skillsets and industries raised by power generation and offshore oil & gas exploration.

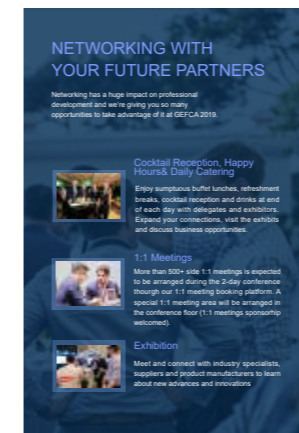

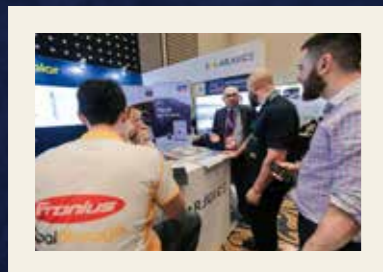

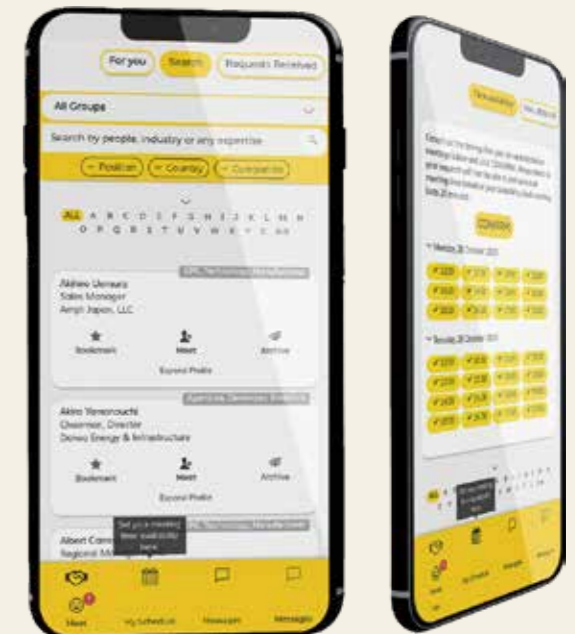
